Ukraine Appeal

A COLLECTION for the people of Ukraine will be held on Saturday 8th November at Abington Primary School from 9am until 12.30pm. Organised by local Rotarian Tony Collett, this will be the sixth collection that the School has kindly supported and is in addition to the sentent that the School has organised in School Molden. They have resulted in 15 tone of food and 42 bears again. Saffron Walden. They have resulted in 15 tons of food and 43 bran -new generators that have been supplied to UK-Aid who have arranged delivery since the inception of these collections.

According to the United Nations' office in Ukraine, there were 49,431 casualties in Ukraine by the end of July, and 3.7 million people are internally displaced within Ukraine's borders. They need: warm clothing and footwear in good condition, sheets and blankets (but not pillows or duvets), everyday canned and dried food, baby food, gluten-free items, medical aid, toiletries cleaning materials, cooking utensils, torches, batteries, and toys, games and educational items. In addition, donations in cash or by card can be made at the Rotary collection point on the 8th November. All monies donated will be going towards the purchase of pallets of food and generators.

Tony Collett says, "The response to our previous collections from residents of the local villages has been truly heart-warming so I am hopeful it will be the same this time." If anyone has any queries, contact Tony on 01223 893447.

Anderson Trust

THE Trustees of the Charles and Mary Anderson Benefaction would be pleased to receive applications for grants for distribution in 2026. The aims of the charity are as follows:

- To sustain the work and worship of St Mary's Church, Linton. To promote education for the benefit of those living in or resorting to Linton, in particular within the Church School.
- Any other charitable purpose for those living in or resorting to Linton.

The Anderson Trust, as it is known, is a small Linton charitable trust, set up through the generosity of previous Linton residents, Dr Charles and Mrs Mary Anderson. The annual interest from this benefaction is distributed by the Trustees in the form of grants, decisions being made according to the criteria set out above, and each application is carefully considered using those criteria. The aim is to help as many people as possible, so modest requests are positively encouraged. In 2025 grants were made, amounting to £10,953 in total, covering varied activities and supporting all ages across the community. Among these was a grant for a defibrillator to be installed at St. Mary's Pavilion, requested by Mrs Anne Parry-Smith.

Applicants need to complete the 2026 application form, which contains further details of the application process. On completion of their training, new recruits need a kit, which costs around £300. The team raises its funds through various channels such as sponsorship, grants, raffles and is always grateful for donations.



100 Parishes - Station Walk

ON a fine September day, I caught an early train to Ware Rib valley, and crosses the before tackling the longest walk on the Society's website. Station Walk number 18 covers 17 miles (28 kilometres) between Ware Station and Stansted Mountfitchet Station. Although I walk regularly, it was some years since I last covered that distance in a day so I carried a mobile phone just in case.

An advantage of this route is that it heads north for several miles and then turns east, so for much of the way the sun is behind to give the best views.

After leaving Ware, the route is all in lovely countryside, passing through eight of our hundred parishes: Wareside, Standon, Thundridge, Braughing and Albury in Hertfordshire and then Farnham, Manuden, and Stansted Mountfitchet in Essex Through these parishes, only Standon and Stansted contributed much more than the occasional farmhouse.

They, along with Gravesend in Albury, also offered opportunities for refreshment.

The route follows a series of good paths and tracks, rising and falling between river valleys. It passes over the River Lea just after the start, spends several miles along the



A Mast Year

THESE days, every time you listen to a rural sort of programme or read wildlife articles, you hear about 2025 being a mast year. This is not yet another mobile phone mast appearing on the Rivey tower, but is instead a natural phenomenon. In the summer, the hedgerows were laden with early blackberries, and there was a glut of apples, figs, plums, crabapples, damsons and bullaces. Even our wisteria has produced giant sized runner-bean-lookalike seed pods. Now there are sloes, conkers, chestnuts, rosehips, holly and hawthorn berries in profusion. We should be using all that

nature provides for us hawthorn berries are reputed to taste like avocados; I'm afraid I wasn't convinced. Rosehips are full of Vitamin C. We have been the lucky recipients of all sorts of produce this year, including greengages and pickled walnuts. But the biggest crops of all have been acorns and beech nuts, and it is these that make 2025 qualify as a mast year.

The word mast comes from the old English word maest, meaning nuts from forest trees. A mast year is when trees produce an unusually large quantity of fruits, nuts and seeds. This happens every few years, caused in part by specific weather conditions such as the right combination of heat and rainfall in the spring. The bumper crop is a feast for wildlife, while providing enough leftovers for new trees to sprout.

A large oak tree can produce 10,000 acorns in a mast year. It can't do that every year, or its growth would be stunted, and there would be a plague of rodents. The strategy is known as predator satiation. In normal years, the seed-eaters consume most of the crop. In a mast year, all the mice, badgers, jays and squirrels can't eat

that number of acorns, so seeds inevitably escape the feeding frenzy and grow into new saplings. At the same time, predators such as owls benefit from the increase in small animals, and woodland generation gets a huge boost.

Is it temperature, pollen exchange, rainfall, underground communication networks, chemical signals

between trees or who knows what, that enables trees to act in unison in a mast year? The one thing scientists agree on is that it is to do with the weather at the time the trees are flowering. Both beeches and oaks rely on wind blown pollen reaching female flowers. If all the beech and the oaks in a wood flower at once in warm windy conditions, the chances of mass fertilisation must be greater.

You can never be bored if you're remotely interested in the natural world there's always something more to learn.



District and County Councillors' Report - October 2025

Local Government Re-organisation AS requested by central government, the process to merge District and County Councils into Unitary Authorities in England, is proceeding. The latest is that all local authorities in Combridge white must submit their suggestions for how Cambridgeshire must submit their suggestions for how best they see a new local government structure working in the county.

Three proposals were originally on the table:

Option A:

- South Cambridgeshire, Cambridge City & East Cambridgeshire
- Fenland, Huntingdonshire & Peterborough

Option B:

- South Cambridgeshire & Cambridge City
 East Cambridgeshire, Huntingdonshire, Fenland & Peterborough

Option C:

- South Cambridgeshire, Cambridge City &
- Huntingdonshire
- Fenland, Peterborough & East Cambridgeshire

We then had a late submission, spearheaded by the MPs in Peterborough, for a fourth option:

Option D:

- An expanded Peterborough
- Fenland, East Cambridgeshire, Huntingdonshire, South Cambridgeshire & Cambridge City

The District Council's preference is Option B, which would leave us in an administrative partnership with Cambridge City only. This is largely what currently happens, with many services already shared between the two authorities. Ultimately, central government will make the final decision so the business cases being drawn up will be highly important in influencing this

The current timeline on this is:

- November 2025 Councils must submit their preference and the corresponding business case to
- May 2026 District Council elections take place on the current local authority boundaries
- May 2027 Elections for the new 'shadow' unitary
- authority take place

 May 2028 The new unitary authorities come into

Kingsway Solar Farm The applicants (Kingsway Solar) of a new solar farm in the vicinities of West Wratting, Weston Colville and Carlton are pressing ahead with their proposals. Kingsway Solar has just released some detail (not just lines drawn around fields on a map) into the public domain. A Formal Consultation was underway for public discussion. This was an important stage since the responses form a part of the planning application. This development will affect us all in some way, regardless of our proximity to the solar sites. The consultation closed on October 29th. All documents can be viewed on the Kingsway Solar website: https:// kingswaysolarfarm.co.uk/.

Kingsway have indicated that they are due to begin preliminary archaeological surveys (digging trial trenches) in some of the fields where solar panels are proposed. If anyone sees this kind of activity, it's very likely to be this.

Acorn Biodigester For those who tracked the planning application for an anaerobic digestion plant just outside of Haverhill, you may recall that Suffolk County Council refused the application in June this year.

The applicants, Acorn, have indicated they are planning to appeal this decision and have instructed their planning agents to do this. So, we can expect this to resurface in the coming months. Watch this space.

Council Tax Consultation The District Council is consulting on the Council Tax Support Scheme for the 2026/27 financial year. This is an opportunity for anyone to give their views on the working age section of the scheme. This specifically looks at levels of discount available to various groups who receive support.

An update from your local MP, Pippa Heylings

OVER parliamentary recess I took the opportunity to meet residents and organisations in South Cambridgeshire. One issue has dominated: the serious funding cut facing the Arthur Rank Hospice. This wonderful organisation, which provides end-of-life care for the terminally ill, is being forced to plan to close nine of its 23 beds: a reduction of 40% of its capacity. At the time of writing, the hospice is facing a funding deficit of

I have visited the hospice several times and heard from their CEO Sharon Allen, their amazing staff, and the patients and families who treasure this resource.

Together with Cambridgeshire's LibDem MPs Charlotte Cane and Ian Sollom, I have started a petition to call on the government to save these vital beds. Over 14,000 people have signed, with 4,500 signatures in just the first 24 hours! This is a resounding call to action that has been well reported in the media.

Given the level of concern and response, our petition is now addressed directly to the Prime Minister, as well as the Secretary of State for Health. ABBREVIATED minutes of the Linton Parish Council | All Agreed. meeting held on Thursday 18th September 2025 at the Finance Cathodeon Centre.

Chairman's Comment

The Chairman formally thanked James Lake for his contribution as a parish councillor and wished him well in his new job, adding that the council very much hopes he will be able to return to the role in the future.

Clerk's Report.

Consideration for the concerns raised by parishioners following the displaying of the St George flag in the

Cllr Karen Sanderson thanked County Councillor Henry Batchelor for his supportive email in relation to the display of flags in the village, which had assisted with responses to parishioners. County Councillor Henry Batchelor advised continuing to report the matter on the CCC website and confirmed the flags placed on publicly owned structures would be removed by the Highways

External Meetings

Update following the Flagship River Project meeting held on 26th August 2025.

Cllr Kate Kell gave an update following the Flagship River Project meeting explaining the project is not part of the Chalk Stream project but runs alongside. The purpose of the project focuses on the weirs in the River Granta in Linton and is looking to improve the watercourse with the parishes consent and support.

Consideration of the District and County Councillors Report for September 2025.

In addition to the written report County Councillor Henry Batchelor added the following points.

Local Government Re-organisation

Cllr Batchelor encouraged everyone to be involved in the process. South Cambridgeshiré District Council prefers Option B due to locality. Cambridgeshire County Council prefers Option A. Each local council will present a preferred option with a business case to Central Government in November, adding that comments are welcomed from members of the public as well as parish

Kingsway Solar Farm

Cllr Batchelor confirmed that the public consultation opened on 17th September 2025 He encouraged the parish councillors and public to review the proposal and comment due to the proximity of the solar farm and the potential impact on the surrounding area, and confirmed the consultation is open until the end of October.

Neighbourhood Plan

Clir Kate Kell confirmed that the response to Liz Lake Associates is being compiled and had provided an update to the office on the stages of the Neighbourhood Plan to assist with responses to correspondence.

Cllr Chris Hine proposed the Assistant Clerk request copies of all available maps from South Cambridgeshire District Council in relation to the area of the Neighbourhood Plan, request the data source for the updated census and provide confirmation that the source is acceptable as evidence to support the plan. The Assistant Clerk to update the LPC website, confirming that Regulation 14 submission had been completed and the plan is progressing to Regulation 15. Karen Sanderson seconded. Agreed.

Kingsway Solar Park Information on the proposed Kingsway Solar Park and an update on the PC Alliance. Cllr Chris Hine proposed that no financial contribution be made as the parish council had not yet taken a decision in relation to the application, but to encourage parishioners to comment on the consultation running from 17th September 2025 to the end of October 2025.
